

Removing the Base Cover

- 1 You have read the safety information that shipped with your computer.
- 1 A component can be replaced or—if purchased separately—installed by performing the removal procedure in reverse order

- 1 Flash BIOS update program CD

Turning Off Your Computer

- NOTICE: To avoid losing data, save and close all open files and exit all open programs before you turn off your computer.
- 1. Save and close all open files and exit all open programs.
- 2. In Windows Vista®, click Start 🚱 , click the arrow 🔤 , and then click Shut Down.

The computer turns off after the operating system shutdown process finishes.

3. Ensure that the computer and any attached devices are turned off. If your computer and attached devices did not automatically turn off when you shut down your operating system, press and hold the power button for at least 8 to 10 seconds until the computer turns off.

Before Working Inside Your Computer

Flashing the BIOS From a CD

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in and that the main battery is installed properly.
- NOTE: If you use a BIOS-update program CD to flash the BIOS, set up the computer to boot from a CD before inserting the CD.
- 2. Insert the BIOS-update program CD, and restart the computer.

Follow the instructions that appear on the screen. The computer continues to boot and updates the new BIOS. When the flash update is complete, the computer will automatically reboot.

- 3. Press <F2> during POST to enter the system setup program.
- 4. Press <Alt> and <F> to reset the computer defaults.
- 5. Press <Esc>, select Save changes and reboot, and press <Enter> to save configuration changes.
- 6. Remove the flash BIOS-update program CD from the drive and restart the computer.

Flashing the BIOS From the Hard Drive

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in, the main battery is properly installed, and a network cable is attached
- 2. Turn on the computer.
- 3. Locate the latest BIOS update file for your computer at support.dell.com.
- 4. Click **Download Now** to download the file.
- 5. If the Export Compliance Disclaimer window appears, click Yes, I Accept this Agreement.

6. Click Save this program to disk and then click OK.



Removing the Center Control Cover



5. Use a processor extraction tool to remove the processor.

- NOTICE: Ensure that the cam lock is in the fully open position before seating the processor. Seating the processor properly in the ZIF socket does not require force.
- NOTICE: A processor that is not properly seated can result in an intermittent connection or permanent damage to the processor and ZIF socket.
- 1. Align the pin-1 corner of the processor so that it points to the triangle on the ZIF socket, and insert the processor into the ZIF socket.
 - When the processor is correctly seated, all four corners are aligned at the same height. If one or more corners of the processor are higher than the others, the processor is not seated correctly.
- NOTICE: To prevent intermittent contact between the ZIF-socket cam screw and the processor when removing or replacing the processor, press to apply slight pressure to the center of the processor while turning the cam screw.
- 2. Tighten the ZIF socket by turning the cam screw clockwise to secure the processor to the system board.
- 3. Peel the backing off the thermal cooling pad and adhere the pad to the portion of the processor heat sink that covers the processor.
- 4. Replace the processor heat sink (see Replacing the Processor Heat Sink).
- 5. Replace the base cover (see Replacing the Base Cover).





- 13. Disconnect the microphone cable connector, fan cable connector, and audio cable connector.
- 14. Pull the system board to detach it from the connector on the charger board.
- 15. Lift the system board at an angle toward the side of the computer and out of the computer base.

Replacing the System Board

- 1. Replace the system board in the computer base.
- 2. Connect the system board to the connector on the charger board.
- 3. Connect the microphone cable connector, fan cable connector, and audio cable connector.
- 4. Replace the five screws (in the reverse order of removal) that secure the system board to the computer base.
- 5. Replace the optical drive (see Replacing the Optical Drive).
- 6. Replace the palm rest (see Replacing the Palm Rest).
- 7. Replace the display assembly (see Replacing the Display Assembly).
- 8. Replace the keyboard (see Replacing the Keyboard).
- 9. Replace the center control cover (see Replacing the Center Control Cover).
- 10. Replace the processor heat sink and processor (see Replacing the Processor Heat Sink and Installing the Processor).
- 11. Replace the hard drive (see Replacing the Hard Drive).
- 12. Reinstall the memory modules and Mini-Cards, if any.
- 13. Reinstall any removed cards in the ExpressCard and 8-in-1 card slots.
- NOTICE: Before turning on the computer, replace all screws and ensure that no stray screws remain inside the computer. Failure to do so may result in damage to the computer.
- 14. Turn on the computer.
 - NOTE: After you have replaced the system board, enter the computer Service Tag into the BIOS of the replacement system board.

15. Insert the BIOS CD that accompanied the replacement system board into the appropriate drive. Follow the instructions that appear on the screen.
